ERNEST R. FORBES is a member of the Department of History, University of New Brunswick. A frequent contributor to *Acadiensis*, he is the author of *The Maritime Rights Movement, 1919-1927: A Study in Canadian Regionalism* (1979) and *Aspects of Maritime Regionalism, 1867-1927* (1983). DOUGLAS O. BALDWIN is the author of a new textbook on Prince Edward Island history, *Abegweit: Land of the Red Soil* (Ragweed Press, 1985). He has written for the *Island Magazine*, *Journal of Canadian Studies* and *Labour/Le Travail* and teaches at the University of Prince Edward Island. An authority on the history of science and technology, DONALD MACLEOD works in Toronto at the Archives of Ontario. His work on Maritime history has appeared in *Historical Papers/Communications historiques* and *Archivaria*. A previous version of his article was presented at the Atlantic Canada Studies Conference in Halifax last year. GERHARD P. BASSLER is a specialist in German and immigration history and a member of the Department of History at the Memorial University of Newfoundland. This year he is publishing a translation of Hans Lehmann's *The German Canadians, 1750-1936: Immigration, Settlement and Culture*. ANN GORMAN CONDON is the author of *The Loyalist Dream for New Brunswick* (New Ireland Press, 1984) and other studies of the Loyalists in British North America. She teaches history at the University of New Brunswick, Saint John. Professor of History at the University of Waterloo, JOHN ENGLISH is the author of *The Decline of Politics: The Conservatives and the Party System, 1901-1920* (1977), and, with Ken McLaughlin, *Kitchener: An Illustrated History* (1983). The former director of the Atlantic Institute of Education, WILLIAM B. HAMILTON is the author of *Local History in Atlantic Canada* (1974), *The Macmillan Book of Canadian Place Names* (1983) and *The Nova Scotia Traveller* (1981). JAMES K. HILLER is head of the Department of History, Memorial University. He has published widely on Newfoundland history and politics and is coeditor, with Peter Neary, of *Newfoundland in the Nineteenth and Twentieth Centuries* (1980). Formerly at the University of Victoria, CHAD GAFFIELD now teaches at the University of Ottawa. His work has appeared in the *History of Education Quarterly*, *Historical Papers/Communications historiques*, *Approaches to Educational History* (1981) and *Childhood and Family in Canadian History* (1982). An earlier version of his review article was presented at the meetings of the Canadian Historical Association in Montreal last year.
