This issue of *Canadian Folklore canadien* marks the completion of its first ten years of publication, and it is appropriate therefore to provide FSAC's current membership with an Index covering this period. The Editor's Note includes some observations on the journal's contents; this brief introduction will be limited to an explanation of the organisation of this index.

It begins with an Alphabetical List by Author, with article title, full volume reference, followed by a sequence of key words, e.g.:
MOUSSETTE, Marcel. *Sens et contresens: l'étude de la culture matérielle au Québec* 4, 1-2 (1982), 7-25. Culture matérielle; théorie; méthodologie; Québec; français.
FOWKE, Edith. *Filksongs as Modern Folksongs* 7, 1-2 (1985), 85-94. Folk-song, popular culture; U.S.A.; English.

The key words or phrases are general indicators only of content; the geographical key is not exclusive, referring to the area of primary interest; the language key refers to the primary ethnic or linguistic group concerned.

The main section on article entries is followed by three slim sections incorporating respectively Research Notes, in the same form as Articles, Obituaries by Author, and Review Articles by Reviewer. The final two sections, of unequal length, cover Book and Record Reviews. The former is listed by Author, title and date of publication, name of reviewer, volume reference; the latter is listed by record title and other available basic information, reviewer and volume reference.

Puisque ce numéro de *Canadian Folklore canadien* signale le complètement de ses dix premières années de publication, il est approprié d'offrir aux membres actuels de l'ACEF un répertoire qui embrasse cette période. L'éditorial fait quelques observations sur le contenu de la revue; cette courte introduction se limitera à expliquer l'organisation du répertoire.

Celui-ci commence par une liste alphabétique par auteur, avec le titre de l'article, la référence complète du volume, suivie d'une série de mots clés, p. ex.:

Le mot clé ou phrase ne sont que des indicateurs d'ordre général du contenu; la clé géographique n'est pas exclusive, se reportant à la région d'intérêt principal; la clé linguistique porte sur le groupe ethnique ou linguistique primaire.

La section principale sur les articles est suivie de trois courtes sections qui incorporent respectivement les notes de recherche, dans le même format que les articles; notices nécrologiques par auteur, et notes critiques par auteur. Les deux dernières sections, de longueur inégale, incorporent les comptes rendus de livres et la discographie. Ce premier donne l'auteur, titre et date de publication, nom du critique et référence au volume. Pour la discographie, il y a classement par titre, d'autres renseignements disponibles, nom du critique, et référence au volume.
