Peter J. Woolley Steps Down as Book Review Editor

In 1995, Peter J. Woolley, a professor of Political Science at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Madison, New Jersey, joined the Editorial Board of *The Journal of Conflict Studies*. Then, in 1997, Peter became the *Journal's* Book Review Editor. Little did he know at the time that this would turn into such a long-term commitment. Year after year Peter faithfully found reviewers for a wide range of books and cajoled the authors into meeting our publication dead-lines.
