(Ottawa, 6 April, 1992) The National Research Council today announced that it will be joined by Industry, Science and Technology Canada, the National Museum of Science and Technology, the Association of Partners in Education, and other public and private sector organizations to establish a Canadian Science and Engineering Hall of Fame.

The Hall of Fame will honour Canadians who have contributed to Canada's rich heritage in scientific, engineering and technological achievement, and encourage young Canadians to pursue careers in science, engineering, and technology. The announcement was made as part of the Festival of Engineering, a national celebration of engineering accomplishments in Canada. The Hall of Fame will also be one of NRC's contributions to Canada's 125th anniversary celebrations.
