This is a handsome, physically durable book. Paper, typography, and plates, both in colour and black

and white, are worthy of the author's treatment of the subject. The publishers have recognized that this will be a standard work of reference for generations. Less commendable though is their punitive mark-up for North American buyers (the two

volume set sells for only £80 in the United Kingdom). One might think that an attempt was underway to limit the circulation of a work of fundamental importance.
