


Fig. 4. *Arthropleura* trails, Cape John,  
Pictou County, N.S. Scale is 25 cm.




Fig. 8. Trails 13 & 14, Smith Point,  
Cumberland County, N.S.




Fig. 9. Detail of footfalls in Trail No.
