Occasional Paper in Geography, # 1 (1972)

The Geography of the Peterborough Area

This collection of articles serves as the background to the series of occasional papers published by Trent. The geological history, settlement history, regional climatology, and biogeography are discussed, as well as Peterborough's urban geography and the recreation potential of the area. Includes a short bibliography of references concerning the Peterborough area. (\$1.50).

Occasional Paper in Geography, # 2 (1974)

Introduction to Geographical Studies in the Peterborough Area

This publication details research done in the Peterborough area concerning glacial landforms, snow, streams, settlement and recreation. The last article of the collection is of especial interest in that it deals with the Geographer's contributions to local and regional issues. (\$2.00)

Occasional Paper in Geography, # 3 (1974)

Measurement in Physical Geography

This publication contains specifications of the research equipment and methods used during recent research at Trent University into lake sediments, snowcover, rainfall simulation, infiltration rates and crystalline limestone weathering rates. The reports on snowcover measurement and rainfall simulation are especially thorough. (\$1.50)

Occasional Paper in Geography, # 4 (1975)

Tourism as a Factor in National and Regional Development

The International Geographical Union's Working Group on the Geography of Tourism and Recreating held a meeting in Canada in 1974. The proceedings of that meeting are published in this Occasional Paper. There are papers by a variety of well-known specialists from several countries. They deal with case studies from diverse parts of the world, and with the theory and methods appropriate to the topic. (probably \$4.00)

Trent Student Geographer, Vol. 1 (1972)

This publication consists of a selection of articles written largely by undergraduate students. Topics presented in this volume include discussion on geographic geomorphology, drumlin development, local geology, Scottish historical geography, European geography and geographical research in Ontario universities. (\$1.50)

Trent Student Geographer, Vol. 2 (1973)

This issue of the Trent Student Geographer is more physically oriented than was its predecessor. Topics discussed include river discharge, sand dune firmness under varying moisture conditions, winter heating of lakes, and comparisons of the cities of Reykjavik and Frobisher Bay. The final article in this volume deals with problems of estimating the climatic potentials of areas for winter recreation, and may be of especial interest to recreation geographers. (\$1.50)

Trent Student Geographer, Vol. 3 (1974)

This volume includes articles on snow hazards, rainfall simulation, and lichenometry as well as articles on bus transportation in Peterborough and railway and settlement growth in southern Ontario. (\$1.50)

Trent Student Geographer, Vol. 4 (1975)**Studies in Recreation**

This specialized issue contains 8 articles on recreation geography as well as a bibliography of recreation reference material and a bibliography of articles contained in Volumes I, II and III and is recommended for all libraries specializing in recreational geography. (\$1.50)

Orienteering in the Peterborough Area (1975)

Prepared in connection with recent Opportunities for Youth projects and the Peterborough Orienteering Club, this book describes the activity of orienteering in general and its pursuit in the Peterborough area. Six large-scale maps of public areas provided with permanent orienteering control markers are included. The areas range in size and degree of challenge to the orienteer. All are described, in full, with suggestions for competitive and educational orienteering use. (52p. 6 maps) (\$3.00)

N.B. Individual copies of the maps for the six areas are available at \$0.40 each; \$0.35 each for orders of ten or more. The areas are 1. Jackson Park, 2. Burnham Park, 3. Nassau Campus Trent University, 4. Warsaw Caves Area, 5. Buckhorn Wilderness Area, and 6. Kashiabog Lake (canoe orienteering).

Périodex. Index analytique de périodiques de langue française. Distribué par La Centrale des bibliothèques, 1685 est, rue Fleury, Montréal, H2C 1T1. Abonnement annuel (10 numéros) : \$155.00.

Périodex paraît depuis 1972 et fait suite à l'*Index analytique* publié auparavant en collaboration avec l'université Laval. *Périodex* dépouille actuellement les articles de 200 périodiques de langue française provenant de France, de Belgique, de Suisse, du Québec et du reste du Canada. *Périodex* est publié par La Centrale des bibliothèques, un organisme du Ministère de l'Éducation du Québec, en vue de desservir spécialement les bibliothèques d'enseignement de tous les niveaux et aussi les autres types de bibliothèques.

Deux modes d'accès sont utilisés pour le repérage des articles : la section A est ordonnée selon des termes précis qui caractérisent soit le sujet principal, soit un des points traités dans l'article ; les descripteurs de la section B constituent un index méthodique par discipline. Dans les deux cas, les descripteurs sont suivis d'une analyse signalétique qui a pour but de donner un aperçu du sujet traité par l'article. Chaque article est classé sous plusieurs descripteurs, multipliant ainsi les chances de le repérer. Plusieurs revues de géographie et d'histoire sont dépouillées dans ce répertoire.
