

STYLE SHEET

I. Submission of an article to the editor:

RS/SI publishes original articles written in French or in English. These articles are not to have been previously published elsewhere, in a journal or as part of a book. The **length of manuscripts** submitted to *RS/SI* averages between 20 to 25 pages double-spaced. Pages should be numbered and the text written in Times 12 point typography. Authors are requested to send two hard-copies (on standard A4 or letter format paper) as well an electronic version of their article (preferably in Word format) either on a CD-R, a DVD or through an e-mail attachment. A **French/English bilingual abstract** (8-10 lines) of the article (or, at least in the language in which the article is written) and a brief **bio-note** (3-6 lines) should also be supplied.

II. Preparation of the manuscript:

Endnotes should be numbered consecutively and be kept exclusively for comments and not for providing bibliographical references. They should be typed on separate sheets of paper and included at the end of the text. Please avoid using automatic footnote function. **References** cited directly or indirectly in the article or in a footnote must be provided in brackets within the article itself. The reference must contain the cited author's name, the date of the publication of the cited text, and the page number of the quotation or indirect quotation.

... “**quotation**” (Piaget 1978: 25).

... as Johansen (1987: 120) explains, “**quotation.**”

... (see Piaget 1978).

All citations in the text must be listed fully in a References section at the end of the manuscript, by alphabetical order of authors, with complete bibliographical details. Journal titles must be given in full, as must book titles. The reference list should present as follows:

Authors are asked to check their manuscripts very carefully before submitting them in order to prevent delays at the proof stage. In particular they are asked to verify in-text citations against listings in the References section, to ensure that dates and spelling match, and that all works cited are listed.

Diagrams: Diagrams and tables (as well as accompanying captions) must be submitted on separate sheets and as separate electronic documents. The text must clearly indicate where they are to be inserted.

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
